### **SGUSA Strategic Session.**

During the year your Society participated in the Strategic planning session of our Union. The main objectives were to review the current position of Senior Golfing in RSA and plan a way forward to ensure that the aims and the objectives of our Societies are met. The main item affecting all Societies was the reduction in overall National Quota which had the effect of reducing the Gauteng Active Member Quota from 229 to 200. This reduction will be implemented over a two year period.

### **Members Rounds**

At the beginning of the year we embarked on a program of firstly informing all members of their playing responsibilities and commitments to Senior Golf. We posted schedules to all members showing their performance for the previous year. We have had a great response over the year and numbers attending the pitch and plays and the timesheet events has improved significantly.

### **Caddie Tournament**

SGUSA advised that the 2014 Annual Caddie Tournament was the last, but would fund suitable PDI initiatives that are supported by their local golf Union.

The Gauteng Committee had agreed to sponsor a local event in conjunction with the Central Gauteng Golf Union. This was held at Royal Johannesburg and Kensington in 2015.
